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Dane County Drug Court Treatment Program

The Drug Court Treatment Program (DCTP) is a single court to which non-violent drug offenders are referred for voluntary participation in a comprehensive rehabilitation program. The goals of the DCTP are to help people recover from addictions while reducing incarceration and criminal justice costs for defendants who present a low risk to public safety. Through participation in DCTP defendants participate in alcohol and drug treatment and other services under the close supervision of the drug court judge to reduce dependency to alcohol and drugs and to change criminal lifestyles.

The Mission of the Dane County Drug Court Treatment Program is:

The Dane County Circuit Court recognizes that people with substance abuse problems commit a majority of crimes committed in Dane County. We believe that in order to reduce this problem, it is necessary to provide offenders with an opportunity to participate in a nationally recognized effective program that combines alcohol and drug treatment with judicial oversight, progressive sanctions, rewards, drug-testing and rigorous case-management supervision. This program will offer educational and employment linkages so that with these tools, participating defendants will possess the ability to become productive members of our community.

A case manager is assigned to each participant and is responsible for guiding participants through their recovery while using the structure of the drug court for support of that goal. In 2010, Dane County Department of Human Services contracted with three different agencies to provide case management as well as several other community agencies to provide access to treatment for participants.

The following report details some of the outcomes achieved by the Dane County Drug Court Treatment Program. The court team, the case managers, treatment providers, and most of all the DCTP participants themselves worked hard to achieve this mission.

KEY FINDINGS

Successful Completion Rate

One demonstration of how well the Dane County DCTP does in helping participants reach sobriety is the Successful Completion Rate. **The Successful Completion Rate of the Dane County DCTP is 64%.** According to the United States Government Accounting Office (2005), **the national average completion rate for drug courts is 45%.**

The successful completion rate is calculated by dividing the total number of graduates by the total number of discharged participants. Those that have been classified as a “neutral discharge” are removed from this calculation. Neutral Discharges has been defined to mean a Drug Court participant who has chosen to leave and at the time of their departure had been adhering to the expectations of the Drug Court Treatment Program. Active clients (32 on December 31, 2010) are also removed from this calculation. The 2010 calculation of the Successful Completion Rate is as follows:

$$\left(\frac{718(\text{Graduates})}{1261(\text{admissions}) - (32(\text{active}) + 100(\text{neutral}))} \right) \times 100\% = 64\%$$

Applying this formula to different groups shows there is minor variation among racial groups and genders. The successful completion rate for all racial minority groups is 61%. The successful completion rate for African-American participants, the largest racial minority group represented, is 60%. The successful completion rate for Caucasian participants is 65%. The successful completion rate for men and women is identical (64%).

Recidivism

Another key indicator of the success of drug courts is whether past participants end the criminal lifestyle that landed them in the program in the first place. According to the National Association of Drug Court Programs, an average of 75% of drug court graduates remain crime-free for at least two years after participating in drug court. In a recent review of the Dane County DCTP, **82% of all 2008 graduates had remained crime-free for at least two years after their graduation.** The percent of all 2008 discharged participants, including those who were terminated from the program, who remain crime-free for two years is still a respectable 69%

On September 29th, 2010 Randall Brown MD PhD, completed and published a study titled Drug Court effectiveness: A matched cohort study in the Dane County Drug Treatment Court. Although the study aims, methods and overall results are too lengthy to review in its entirety here. The conclusion is that drug treatment court is more effective than traditional adjudication in reducing the likelihood of recidivism and increasing time to recidivism for drug involved offenders. Effectiveness appears to be enhanced for some sub-groups, including minorities, those with more serious criminal histories and for women.

Criminal Charges

In exchange for participation in and graduation from the DCTP, defendants may be subject to a lesser penalty for their crimes, have their initial charges reduced, or have their cases dropped altogether, depending on the individual plea agreements. The types of cases referred to the DCTP are for increasingly more serious offenses. In 1999, 88% of referrals were for possession charges (drug or paraphernalia). **In 2010 possession cases just represented 40% of all referrals. Accordingly, felonies comprised 49% of all referrals in 2010,** compared to 12% in 1999. Examples of felony charges referred to the DCTP include: prescription fraud, theft, and possession with intent to deliver, burglary, and forgery.

Other Societal Benefits

DCTP graduates obtain sobriety and lead a crime-free lives, as a result; there are several other benefits associated with the drug court program. The following are just a few of those benefits realized by all discharged participants, as calculated from the inception of the DCTP:

- 42% (439 participants) obtained either full or part time employment.
- 36% (372) remained in, enrolled in, or graduated from high school/GED, college or vocational educational programs.
- 70% (726) were able to retain their employment.
- 44 drug-free babies have been born to active DCTP participants.
- 33 parents became reunited with their minor children.
- 49 parents resumed child support payments.
- 27 parents became current with child support payments.
- 78 parents continued child support payments.

Historical Data

The balance of this report includes tables containing information that has been collected since the inception of the Dane County DCTP. All 1996 data represents partial-year information as the DCTP began operation in June 1996.
